<b>Purpose</b>	<p>This unit standard is for people who are employed in a rabbit processing operation to supervise staff trained to carry out ante-mortem examinations of rabbits.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to: move, handle, and examine live rabbits; demonstrate understanding of, and detect diseases and defects in rabbits, make judgements and apply dispositions to examined rabbits in a rabbit processing operation.</p>

*Dispositions* – action of ensuring examined animal material that has abnormalities is managed in accordance with legislative requirements.

*Workplace procedures* – the verbal and written policies and procedures on safety and operation set down by the employer or organisation.
- 4 In the context of this unit standard, *understanding* means that there should be evidence of a learner's thorough comprehension of a topic. A learner with a good understanding of a topic should have applied, or should be able to apply what they have learnt to a workplace situation and will be able to alter their practices to the

different contexts they are applying their learning to. Assessors should be confident that the learner's understanding is embedded in their practices and behaviour.

## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Move, handle, and examine live rabbits in a rabbit processing operation.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Handle rabbits in a rabbit processing facility with minimum stress and least risk of injury to operator.
- 1.2 Examine rabbits according to industry standards.

### Outcome 2

Demonstrate understanding of the diseases seen during ante-mortem examination of rabbits.

#### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe the visual signs or symptoms of at least five common diseases commonly seen at ante-mortem examination according to industry standards.

### Outcome 3

Detect diseases and defects in rabbits, make judgements and apply dispositions to examined rabbits in a rabbit processing operation.

#### Performance criteria

- 3.1 Detect diseases and defects seen during ante-mortem examination.
- 3.2 Make judgements on ante-mortem examination findings, and apply dispositions to inspected rabbit.
