- 1.3 The ability to view, incise and palpate animal tissues as required for the procedures on emus or ostriches for human consumption is described.
- 1.4 Different disposition criteria are described.
 - Range includes but is not limited to human consumption, animal consumption, sample for further analysis, remove/condemn.

Outcome 2

Perform post-mortem examination of emus or ostriches for human consumption.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Animal product post-mortem examination procedures are performed according to industry standards.
 - Range includes but is not limited to safe handling and maintenance of a knife, applicable hygiene practices, use of personal protective equipment, ability to view/incise/palpate animal tissue required for post-mortem examination.

Outcome 3

Identify the diseases and defects found at post-mortem examination of emus or ostriches and apply the disposition.

Performance criteria

3.1 Diseases in emus or ostriches which effect the intended fitness for purpose of the animal products are identified.

Range includes but is not limited to – the disposition criteria and regulatory recording requirements for emus or ostriches for human consumption.

3.2 Dispositions to inspected animal products are applied.
