- 1 Definition
Whānau Ora is about empowering whānau to take control of their future: to be self-determining (cohesive, resilient and nurturing); confidently participating in Te Ao Māori; to be living healthy lifestyles; to be participating fully in society; and to be economically secure; with initiatives that add value, build upon the strengths and capabilities already present in the whānau, and lead to better outcomes for whānau.
- 2 Legislation relevant to this unit standard may include but is not limited to the Treaty of Waitangi Act 1975; Health and Safety at Work Act 2015; and any subsequent changes.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of whanaungatanga in relation to whānau ora.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Explain personal relationships with whānau, hapū, iwi, and hapori.
- 1.2 Explain whānau ora and its relationship to whānau, hapū, iwi, hapori.

Outcome 2

Explain the connection between whānau and whakapapa.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 The roles and responsibilities of whānau to whakapapa are explained.
- 2.2 The roles of Ranginui and Papatūānuku, and one atua Māori are explained.
- 2.3 The connection between ngā atua Māori and tangata Māori is explained.

Outcome 3

Explain the connection whānau have to land, estates, forests and fisheries and other properties.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Land, estates, forests and fisheries and other properties are explained in terms of whānau connection.
- 3.2 Land, estates, forests and fisheries and other properties are explained in terms of whānau practices.

Outcome 4

Explain reciprocity in relation to hui.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 One act of reciprocity relating to koha is explained.
- 4.2 One act of reciprocity relating to tau rourou, taku rourou is explained.
- 4.3 One act of reciprocity relating to ka tika ki muri, ka tika ki mua is explained.
