- 2 *Pūkengatanga* in this unit standard, refers to the importance of: new knowledge, technologies to enhance and advance; models of whānau-centred practices and services; as part of continuous self-improvement; and sharing lessons learnt with other practitioners, providers, whānau and other key stakeholders.
