

Title	Demonstrate and apply knowledge of safety management and risk assessment for outdoor experiences

Purpose	<p>This unit standard is intended for people who provide safety management and risk assessment for outdoor experiences.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to: demonstrate knowledge of risk and hazard management for outdoor experiences; describe a risk management plan for a specific outdoor experience; manage risk to self during an outdoor experience; and reflect on self-management of risk at conclusion of the outdoor experience.</p>

All learning and assessment leading towards this standard must be carried out in accordance with the following, as relevant to role and experience:

- relevant legislation including Health and Safety at Work Act 2015, Human Rights Act 1993, Vulnerable Children Act 2014 and The Health and Safety in Employment (Adventure Activities) Regulations 2016, Maritime New Zealand Rule Part 81 and subsequent amendments;
- relevant Activity Safety Guidelines published by Worksafe New Zealand
- industry Codes including the Snow Responsibility Code, the Outdoor Safety Code and 'Leave No Trace' principles;
- a recognised and approved safety management system including organisational policies and procedures including Emergency Action Plans (EAPs), Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), and the use of personal protective equipment (PPE).

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of risk and hazard management for outdoor experiences.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Explain the dimensions of risk for a planned outdoor experience in terms of severity and frequency.

- 1.2 Explain the purpose and use of risk and hazard management tools and frameworks used in the outdoor recreation industry.
- 1.3 Explain the importance of managing risk in terms of people, equipment, and environment.
- 1.4 Describe how enhanced awareness of situational hazards can contribute to better personal risk management.

Range own state, external environment.

Outcome 2

Describe a risk management plan for a specific outdoor experience.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe the key components of a risk management plan for a specific outdoor experience.
- Range key components include but are not limited to – risk identification, risk reduction strategies.
- 2.2 Describe strategies to manage risk to an acceptable level for a specific outdoor experience.

Outcome 3

Manage risk to self during a specific outdoor experience.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Environment is scanned to identify potential risks and hazards, and risk management strategies are followed in accordance with current industry practice.
- Range risks and hazards may include but are not limited to – serious injury, medical emergency, cultural issue, environmental issue, emotional issue, loss of or damage to equipment, weather conditions.
- 3.2 Identified risks are managed in accordance with the risk management plan.
- 3.3 Personal response to any incident that occurs during the outdoor experience is in accordance with the emergency action plan and organisational safety management system.

Outcome 4

Reflect on self-management of risk at conclusion of the outdoor experience.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 Differences between the planned and actual risk management strategies used are explained.
- 4.2 The strengths and weaknesses in own risk management planning and implementation are identified and recommendations made for future improvements.
