Allied health professionals refers to individuals who have a distinct, specialised body of knowledge and skills, and actively work with people to access health and disability services across a range of settings. These individuals will have a relevant tertiary (or equivalent) education qualification, have a professional association, an appropriate code of ethics and standards of practice, and a recognised system for monitoring ongoing competence. In their practice, allied health professionals provide services and engage in activities which may include: prevention, assessment/evaluation, identification/diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation/habilitation, advocacy, promotion of health and wellbeing, education, research, leadership/management.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Develop networks with allied health professionals for the referral of exercise participants.

Performance criteria

1.1 Explain the scope of practice for allied health professionals and how an exercise participant would benefit from referral.

- 1.2 Explain the benefits of a multidisciplinary approach to enhance health and exercise outcomes.
- 1.3 Establish criteria on how to compare and select reputable allied health professionals for referral of exercise participants.

- 1.5 Establish the type and sufficiency of information to be communicated to an allied health professional.
