Current industry good practice means the range of actions currently accepted within the adventure and outdoor sector to manage the risk of harm to staff, participants, and visitors.

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of the responsibilities and operating scope of the outdoor leader role.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Explain the responsibilities of an outdoor leader in terms of group management and risk management.
- 1.2 Discuss the operating scope of the outdoor leader role in terms of environment and activity selection, and working under the guidance or direction of an outdoor guide or instructor.
- 1.3 Explain the differences between leading, guiding and instructing outdoor recreation experiences and establish boundaries for own role and practice.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of leadership for outdoor recreation activities.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe advantages and limitations of different leadership styles in terms of managing groups and individuals for a range of factors.
- 2.2 Explain leadership processes in terms of setting ground rules, role modelling, and managing professional distance for outdoor recreation activities.
- 2.3 Describe strategies for addressing problematic individual and group behaviours.
- 2.4 Explain physical, emotional and social factors that can affect the judgement of the leader and participants during an outdoor recreational experience.

Outcome 3

Describe effective communication for leading outdoor recreation activities.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Explain effective verbal and non-verbal communication for leading outdoor recreation activities.
 - Range briefing, feedback, questioning, and providing leadership.
- 3.2 Explain interpersonal skills required for building rapport in outdoor recreation activities.

- 3.3 Describe barriers to communication in outdoor recreation.
 - Range distracting activities, other groups, physical location and position, group size and spread, and environmental conditions.
- 3.4 Explain strategies to address barriers to effective communication in outdoor recreation activities.
