Range incidents may include but are not limited to – vehicle off the road, fire, environmental factors, missing person, first aid incidents, heli-evacuation, lift evacuation; minimum of two incidents.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Lead a ski patrol emergency response in the role of on-scene coordinator.
 - Range role of on scene co-ordinator includes but is not limited to demonstrating managing in the moment, coordinating an onsite team (including witnesses), communicating to incident controller and other key points of contact, recording incident information, coordinating debriefs.
- 1.2 Lead emergency care first responses at incidents and trauma-based situations within a snowsport area.

Outcome 2

Apply avalanche search and rescue skills to lead an initial avalanche response team at a snowsport area incident.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Lead an initial avalanche response team at a snowsport area incident.
- 2.2 Apply avalanche search and rescue skills within an initial avalanche response.

Range search and rescue skills include but are not limited to – efficient transceiver searching, probing, shovel technique.
