#### Outcome 1

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 The New Zealand Police Ngā Pirihimana o Aotearoa are described in terms of their values and roles in society.
- 1.2 Description includes three specific services the New Zealand Police Ngā Pirihimana o Aotearoa provide and their effects on society.
- 1.3 Different types of policing are described in terms of their purpose.

Range may include but is not limited to – public safety, crime prevention, Youth Aid, community constables, search and rescue, road safety, armed offenders, dog handlers, emergency response, electronic crime;  
evidence of three required.

#### Outcome 2

Describe rights, obligations, and procedures in relation to New Zealand Police Ngā Pirihimana o Aotearoa law enforcement.

**Performance criteria**

- 2.1 A person's rights and obligations are described in terms of New Zealand Police Ngā Pirihi mana o Aotearoa law enforcement.
- Range one of – for a person over 17 years of age, for a person under 17 years of age;  
at least one right and one obligation in relation to each of – being stopped, being questioned, being searched, being arrested, when called upon for assistance, as a witness.
- 2.2 Procedures which must be followed by the New Zealand Police Ngā Pirihi mana o Aotearoa when questioning, arresting, and charging are described according to legislation.
- Range one of – for a person over 17 years of age, for a person under 17 years of age.
- 2.3 Description identifies procedure for making a complaint against the New Zealand Police Ngā Pirihi mana o Aotearoa.
