

<b>Title</b>	<b>Plan, instruct and evaluate a tramping skills session in easy to moderate off-track terrain</b>

<b>Purpose</b>	<p>This unit standard is intended for people who provide tramping instruction in easy to moderate off-track terrain.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to: plan a tramping skills session in easy to moderate off-track terrain; and instruct and evaluate tramping skills session in easy to moderate off-track terrain.</p>

*Current industry good practice* means the range of actions currently accepted within the adventure and outdoor sector to manage the risk of harm to staff, participants, and visitors.

## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Plan a tramping skills session in easy to moderate off-track terrain.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Develop a plan for instructing a given tramping skills session including a logical sequence of teaching progressions and activities.

### Outcome 2

Instruct and evaluate tramping skills session in easy to moderate off-track terrain.

#### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Instruct tramping skills in a suitable location using clear instructions, demonstrations and explanations.
- Range must include but is not limited to – movement off-track, basic off-track navigation, hazard management.
- 2.2 Use teaching strategies to engage participants in a tramping skills session.
- 2.3 Use a logical sequence of teaching progressions while instructing a tramping skills session.
- 2.4 Provide feedback to participants on bush tramping skills.
- 2.5 Evaluate personal instruction practice to identify aspects for development.
