Outcome 1

Demonstrate and apply knowledge of the use and maintenance of multi-pitch rock climbing equipment commonly used in New Zealand.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Summarise the development, trends and use of rock climbing equipment in use in New Zealand.
- 1.2 Perform general maintenance and repairs of commonly used rock climbing equipment.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate multi-pitch rock climbing skills on routes up to Ewbank Grade 20.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Demonstrate controlled movement while multi-pitched rock climbing.
- 2.2 Demonstrate multi-pitch lead climbing skills.
 - Range includes placing protection, lead belaying and bringing a second up.
- 2.3 Construct multi-directional anchor systems used for multi-pitch climbing.
- 2.4 Construct a multi-pitched abseil system.

Outcome 3

Perform multi-pitch climbing rescues.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Release a weighted belay device.
- 3.2 Perform rope rescues for multi-pitched climbing.

Range includes – escaping the system, abseiling to the climber, assisted and unassisted hoist.

3.3 Perform multi-pitched abseil with a frightened or injured climber.
