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## **Guidance Information**

- 1 Reo Māori media refers to the use of te reo Māori incorporating tikanga, and kaupapa Māori in the media.
- 2 Recommended for entry: Unit 7269, Whakawhitiwhiti kōrero māmā tētahi ki tētahi; Unit 7270, Kōrero mōna ake me āna mahi; Unit 7271, Kōrero mō ētahi atu me ā rātou mahi; Unit 7272, Kōrero mō tōna ao o ia rā, o ia rā.
- This unit standard can be assessed in a work-based environment, or in a training and education environment if simulated media and Māori culture conditions are provided, or in a combination of both environments.
- 4 Live commentaries include sports events, cultural performances, tangihanga, court proceedings. A minimum of two events is required to be covered.
- 5 Definitions

House style refers to the style of writing and/or speech in accordance with the kaupapa, and the iwi the kaupapa is relevant to.

Live outside broadcast refers to an off-site location which is inside or outside. Language refers to aspects of te reo Māori such as te whakahua, te mita, te tangi, me te hāngai ki te kaupapa.

Structure refers to intro, outro, body of work.

## Outcomes and performance criteria

## Outcome 1

Plan to deliver a live outside commentary in te reo Māori.

Range commentaries for two events is required.

## Performance criteria

- 1.1 Plan relevant and accurate background information in accordance with the chosen kaupapa.
- 1.2 Plan formatted notes written in te reo Māori to assist the delivery of commentary for a live outside event.

Range includes – structure, background, keywords, contingency plan, terminology.

- 1.3 Plan appropriate kīwaha, pepehā and whakatauki relevant to the kaupapa and house style requirements.
- 1.4 Plan an appropriate delivery style and conventions that meet house style requirements.

Range includes – terminology, audience age and gender, formality of language honorifics, tenses, application of tikanga.

1.5 Plan the technical requirements to assist in the delivery of the live outside commentary.

Range may include but is not limited to – equipment, personnel, potential technical issues, environmental and communication issues.

1.6 Plan an engagement strategy with the audience.

Range may include but is not limited to – audience feedback, rebroadcast, peer review, audience survey; evidence of one is required.

1.7 Plan effective time-management of the live outside commentary.

Range schedule and/or run sheet, broadcast plan, broadcast schedule.

1.8 Establish a reconnaissance plan.

Range site management plan, timing, weather impacts, consents and permission for recording and broadcast.
