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Guidance Information

- 1 *English Language (EL)* refers to the acquisition of English as an additional language.
- 2 This unit standard is at a level comparable to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) mid B2. It is intended for learners with increasing independence in English. - 3 This unit standard may contribute to the New Zealand Certificate in English Language (General) (Level 4) [Ref: 3669]. Assessment of outcomes must clearly reflect the general context. The requirements of this standard are consistent with the *NZCEL Guiding Document*. This document includes guidelines relating to appropriate texts, task specifications and assessment conditions and can be found at <http://www.nzqa.govt.nz>.
- 4 All assessment activities must be conducted in English, which must not be the candidate's first language.
- 5 The assessor must be satisfied that the candidate can independently demonstrate competence against the unit standard.

- 6 It is recommended that:
- i the outcomes are assessed as part of an integrated unit of work, relevant to the learning context of the candidate;
 - ii assessment be conducted in conjunction with assessment against other English Language unit standards at this level.
- 7 Candidate's responses may be oral, written or visual, as relevant and appropriate. Responses may contain textual or linguistic errors and inaccuracies, but these must not obscure meaning. This standard assesses reading skills, not spoken or written skills.
- 8 For this unit standard, texts:
- i must be chosen independently by the candidate;
 - ii must be guided by the first 2500 words of *New General Service List*.

- 11 Definition
Extended written text is one that merits more than two weeks of teaching and learning focus, and is aligned with the complexity and range statements of this unit standard.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Read and understand a range of extended written texts independently (EL).

Range extended written text types may include but are not limited to – novels, collections of short stories, drama, poetry, series of articles, biographies, reference books, websites;
minimum of four extended texts, at least two of which are of different text types.

Performance criteria

1.1 Reading log records the date of reading, title, text type, and author or source of each text.

1.2 Evidence of engagement with, and/or expressing viewpoints on texts is included.

Range evidence of engagement may include but is not limited to – reflection on, comparison of texts.
