Guidance Information

- 1 *Health literacy* is the capacity to find, interpret and use information and health services to make effective decisions for health and wellbeing.
- 2 *Pūkenga* refers to skills that may include but are not limited to – te reo Māori, tikanga Māori, leadership, communication, life skills, numeracy, literacy, social and cooperative skills, financial, problem solving, self-management and competitive skills.
- 3 *Whānau Ora* is about empowering whānau to take control of their future; to be self-determining (cohesive, resilient and nurturing); confidently participating in te ao Māori; to be living healthy lifestyles; to be participating fully in society; and to be economically secure; with initiatives that add value, build upon the strengths and capabilities that lead to better outcomes for whānau, hapū, iwi and hāpori.
