<b>Purpose</b>	<p>This unit standard is intended for those working in the interior linings industry.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to demonstrate understanding of and receive, handle and store materials used for fixing interior linings to the level required of a commercially competent interior linings fixer.</p>

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### Guidance Information

This unit standard is one of a family of standards that align with the *New Zealand Certificate in Interior Linings Installation – Specifications* and should be read, interpreted and assessed in the context of those *Specifications* and the New Zealand Certificate in Interior Linings Installation (Level 4) with strands in Fixing and Finishing (with optional strand in Fibrous Plaster Installation) [Ref: 3061].

The overarching level of performance for the family of unit standards is commercial competence.

Commercial competence requires a candidate to be capable of consistently performing the requirements of the unit specification:

- to current regulatory, industry and commercial standards
- within a commercially viable timeframe
- in commercial environments
- without supervision
- in different and unfamiliar contexts.

The sufficiency of evidence required to demonstrate commercial competence against this unit standard is determined within the context of the family of unit standards aligned to the *Specifications*.

The assessor must be confident that the candidate is capable of applying the skills and knowledge included in this skill specification to the level, scope and complexity required to support the achievement of related skills included in the *Specifications*.

Commercial competence can only be demonstrated, and must be assessed, in the workplace.

The assessment of commercial competence must be corroborated and confirmed by a person who has current expertise in the interior linings installation trade and has had the opportunity to regularly observe the candidate in the workplace.

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## Skill specification and performance level guidance

### Skill specification

Demonstrate understanding of and receive, handle and store materials used for fixing interior linings.

**Know** Types, properties and uses of sheet linings.

Types, properties and uses of mouldings and trim used when fixing interior sheet linings.

Types, properties and uses of accessories used when fixing interior sheet linings.

How sheet linings are manufactured.

How to handle and store materials.

**Do** Receive, handle and store materials used for fixing interior linings.

### Performance level guidance

Materials include sheet linings, mouldings and trim, and accessories.

Types of sheet linings include plaster board and fibre cement board.

Properties of sheet lining materials include physical composition and attributes such as size, thickness, finish, edge treatments and the ability to form into curves and resist impact, water, fire, sound and horizontal loads.

Sheet linings include those requiring additional work by finishing trades once fixed and pre-finished sheet linings.

Types of mouldings and trim include jointers, angles, cappings or any pre-formed item installed by an interior linings fixer at the edge of a sheet or the junction between two sheets.

Types of accessories include fixings, fasteners and adhesives.

The level of materials knowledge required is that of an industry practitioner rather than that of an expert with specialist knowledge.
