*SWOT* refers to strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats. *Whānau Ora* is about empowering whānau to take control of their future: to be selfdetermining (cohesive, resilient and nurturing); confidently participating in Te Ao Māori; to be living healthy lifestyles; to be participating fully in society; and to be economically secure; with initiatives that add value, build upon the strengths and capabilities already present in the whānau, and lead to better outcomes for whanau.
