1.3 Materials and equipment are prepared in accordance with job specifications.

Apply paint by spray methods for a marine surface.

- 2.1 Coatings are applied by spray methods in accordance with manufacturer's specifications and job specifications.
- 2.2 Finished coatings are checked and action is taken if required, to ensure job specifications are met.
