Industry requirements refer to relevant policies, processes, methodologies, industry codes of practice, site specific health and safety plans, standard operating procedures, site safety plans, quality plans, work plans, traffic management plans, contract work programmes, job safety analysis, safe work method statements, job instructions, manufacturer's requirements, contract specifications, manuals, procedural documents.

Job instructions are those given to the operator prior to undertaking a job. They may include site safety instructions, contract drawings, and written memos. Services refer to public utilities such as power, telecommunications, water, wastewater, stormwater, and gas and to privately owned networks such as farm irrigation systems.

- 1.1 Types of services are identified and described in terms of the consequences of damage caused to them during infrastructure works.

- 1.5 Procedures for managing and reporting damage to services are described in accordance with service provider requirements and any relevant controlling authority.
