Guidance information

- 1 Candidates will have a level of understanding of their role in the powhiri process that enables them to participate successfully.
- The basic principles underpinning tikanga are common, but while there are some constants, the details of performance of tikanga, and their explanation, may differ. These differences may be at a rohe, iwi, hapū, whānau, or marae level. The context of the learning should include the tikanga of the local mana whenua (if capable) but learning others' tikanga is also encouraged. This is in order to enrich and enhance understanding of tikanga, and the associated reo.

3 Definitions

Kawa are the protocols or customs of the marae (and inside the wharenui); particularly those related to formal activities such as pōwhiri, karanga, whaikōrero etc. Kawa can be particular to marae, and may vary amongst whānau, hapū, and iwi. *Tikanga* are cultural practices and procedures exercised by Māori in their daily lives. These practices reflect the concepts upon which they are based and provide guidelines for appropriate behaviour in Māori society. They also prescribe consequences for any breaches or when tikanga is not followed. They can be particular to a marae, whānau, hapū, rohe, or iwi.

4 Assessment

The context of the learning should include the tikanga of the local mana whenua (where applicable) and the kawa of their marae. Where local rohe are also occupied by a number of other iwi or hapū, the tangata whenua or mana whenua view should be considered. Other iwi or hapū views should be encouraged in order to enrich and enhance understanding of tikanga, kawa, and the associated reo.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Participate in the powhiri process.

Performance criteria

1.1 Participation is consistent with the cultural protocols of the powhiri process and in accordance with tikanga and kawa.

Range may include but is not limited to – whakaeke, hongi, koha, waiata

tautoko, whakanoa.

1.2 Appropriate behaviours are demonstrated during powhiri in accordance with tikanga and kawa.

Range appropriate behaviours include but are not limited to – formal

standards of dress, being respectful, being attentive, observing,

participating, singing.
