Purpose	This unit standard is intended for people who provide introductory high ropes activities using traversing and climbing activities.
	People credited with this unit standard are able to: plan and prepare for a traversing and climbing high ropes activities session; demonstrate group and safety management while leading traversing and climbing high ropes activities session; lead a group for a traversing and climbing high ropes activities session; apply knowledge of environmental practices and cultural awareness for high ropes activities in outdoor environments in Aotearoa New Zealand; and evaluate own performance as a traversing and climbing high ropes leader.

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2 Definitions

Activities are elements used on a high ropes course, and exercises relevant to using a high ropes course, e.g. exercises preparing the group to perform necessary safety roles.

Current industry good practice means the range of actions currently accepted within the adventure and outdoor sector to manage the risk of harm to staff, participants, and visitors.

Session is a number of high ropes activities or elements.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Plan and prepare for a traversing and climbing high ropes activities session.

Performance criteria

1.1 Create an activity plan for a traversing and climbing activities session on high ropes.

Range defined purpose, logical sequence of progressions, any consent or access requirements, individual and group gear and equipment

needs.

- 1.2 Select activities suitable for a group, identifying hazards and risk management strategies.
- 1.3 Create a pre-activity emergency plan for a traversing and climbing high ropes activities session.

Range emergency planning includes but is not limited to – emergency equipment, internal and external communication, first aid kit

contents, knowledge of group's skill-set and health issues.

- 1.4 Obtain a weather forecast and describe how it could affect the planned session.
- 1.5 Perform pre-session tasks including gathering medical information and completing gear and equipment checks.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate group and safety management while leading a traversing and climbing high ropes activities session.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Use leadership strategies to engage, encourage and motivate participants.
- 2.2 Explain emergency and first aid procedures for high ropes activities.

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2.3 Demonstrate group management and safety techniques and strategies.

Range monitoring individual task completion rates, participant behaviour,

leader positioning, communication; and accounting for all group

members.

Outcome 3

Lead a group for a traversing and climbing high ropes activities session.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Prepare and brief the group in terms of activity requirements, participant gear and equipment, personal medication, and emergency and first aid procedures.
- 3.2 Instruct traversing and climbing skills for a high ropes activities session in a logical sequence with progressions.
- 3.3 Monitor changes in the weather and modify the session as required.

Outcome 4

Apply knowledge of environmental practices and cultural awareness for high ropes activities in outdoor environments in Aotearoa New Zealand.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 Follow minimal impact and sustainable practices.
- 4.2 Demonstrate respect for the environment through the personal application of environmentally sustainable principles.
- 4.3 Demonstrate awareness of the physical, emotional and cultural needs of group participants by responding to needs.

Outcome 5

Evaluate own performance as a traversing and climbing high ropes leader.

Performance criteria

- 5.1 Reflect on planning and own leadership practice to identify areas of success and areas for improvement.
- 5.2 Collect feedback from a variety of sources on the planning and leadership of a high ropes activity.

Range sources may include but are not limited to – supervisor, peers, participants.

5.3 Evaluate feedback to identify actions for improvement as a high ropes leader.
