2.2 Identify, record, and report signs of ill-health in poultry, and take remedial action as required.

Range includes but is not limited to – morbidity, mortality, noise or lack of

noise or abnormal noise, huddling, lack of appetite, loss of production or growth, reduced water consumption, lameness or

immobility;

abnormal – feathering, droppings, breathing, distribution.
