Range evidence is required for at least one gastrointestinal disease, and

at least one other disease.

2.2 Describe the effects of sub clinical diseases on pig performance.

Range respiratory, gastro intestinal, reproductive;

evidence of two is required.

2.3 Describe exotic diseases that affect pigs in terms of the methods of identification, national response, biosecurity implications, producer responsibilities, and on farm response.

Range must include – foot and mouth disease, swine vesicular disease,

African swine fever.

Outcome 3

Describe the development and monitoring of a preventative health programme for a pig farm.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Describe the steps in developing a health programme for pigs.
- 3.2 Describe the components of a pig farm preventative health programme.

Range must include – personnel, biosecurity, source of breeding stock,

quarantine, acclimation, hygiene, all in all out, colostrum, vaccination and treatment plan, parasite and pest control;

evidence of six is required.

3.3 Describe procedures for monitoring the health programme on a pig farm.
