Purpose	People credited with this unit standard are able to: train and critique riverboard guides in riverboard guiding skills; train and critique riverboard guides in river rescue; and critique and update organisational river safety and training procedures for riverboard trips.

- 2 Definition
Current industry good practice means the range of actions currently accepted within the adventure and outdoor sector (which includes the raft and riverboard industries) to manage the risk of harm to staff, participants, and visitors.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Train and critique riverboard guides in riverboard guiding skills.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Train riverboard guides in the delivery of safety briefings and in the instruction of the skills required to participate in the riverboard trip.
- Range must include – client screening;
may also include – board holds, turns, entering and exiting eddies, effective positioning on board, kicking, turn in deep water, turn in shallow water, duck diving, barrel rolls, board recovery.
- 1.2 Train riverboard guides in rapid management skills and techniques including on-river scouting, communication and signals.
- 1.3 Train riverboard guides in the use of river etiquette with other users.
- 1.4 Critique riverboard guides on their guiding performance and provide constructive feedback for improvements in their practice.

Outcome 2

Train and critique riverboard guides in river rescue.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Train riverboard guides in hazard and emergency management.
- 2.2 Train riverboard guides in the rope systems and skills used in whitewater river rescue situations.
- Range may include – anchors, rope rescue knots, bends and hitches.
- 2.3 Train riverboard guides in effective throw-bag rescue rescues.
- Range may include – deploying full length of throw bag accurately, 10 metre coil throw, static and dynamic belay technique.
- 2.4 Critique riverboard guides on their performance of river rescue skills and provide constructive feedback for improvements in their practice.

Outcome 3

Critique and update organisational river safety and training procedures for riverboard trips.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Critique organisational river safety and training procedures to identify opportunities for improvement.
- 3.2 Update hazard and risk procedures, risk register and training procedures in response to findings, as required.
