3 Definitions

Bale – defined as being between a minimum of 100kg and maximum of 200kg in weight.

Minimum industry quality requirements – the minimum number of skin cuts, tassels, second cuts, and ridges.

On-farm procedures – refer to the verbal or written instructions to staff on procedures for animal care, welfare, and management.

Penning up – filling up the catching pen with sheep.

Wool market representative requirements – contract specifications as set out by the wool buyer.

Workplace procedures – instructions to staff on procedures that are documented in memo, electronic or manual format and available in the workplace.

4 All wool harvesting tasks must ensure safe work practices are followed and be conducted under supervision.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Assist with safely setting up a woolshed for use.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Set up the woolshed for use, demonstrating safe work practices and maintaining awareness of potential hazards in accordance with on-farm procedures.
- 1.2 Undertake basic maintenance of equipment during set up of a woolshed.
 - Range may include but is not limited to filling oil bottles, oiling gate hinges, oiling down tubes, check floor grating, check lighting safety equipment.
- 1.3 Identify any hazards which may impact on the safe set up of the woolshed.
 - Range may include but is not limited to broken gates, broken floor grating damage on the shearing board, lack of safety equipment.

Outcome 2

Assist with penning up sheep.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Identify and keep mobs separate in accordance with on-farm procedures.
- 2.2 Handle sheep into catching pens, causing minimum stress and avoiding injury to self or sheep.

Outcome 3

Crutch and shear sheep under supervision.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Crutch sheep without injury to self or sheep and remove all dirty wool from the crutch area in accordance with animal welfare requirements and on-farm procedures.
- 3.3 Catch and present sheep for shearing in accordance with animal welfare requirements and on farm procedures.
- 3.3 Shear sheep using a sequence and pattern and without injury to self or sheep in accordance with minimum industry quality requirements.

Outcome 4

Assist with wool preparation.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 Identify and separate the parts of the fleece in accordance with minimum industry quality requirements.
- 4.2 Collect the fleece from the board and throw onto the wool table, ensuring the entire fleece remains on the table.
- 4.3 Identify and separate wool faults from the main part of the fleece in accordance with minimum industry quality requirements.

Range length, colour, contamination.

Outcome 5

Assist with pressing wool.

Performance criteria

- 5.1 Check and report any problems which may affect the safe operation of the wool press prior to use in accordance with workplace procedures.
- 5.2 Assist with preparing wool and associated equipment for pressing.

Range may include but is not limited to – fadges, bale clips and tools, bale hooks, wool press pins, marker pen.

- 5.3 Assist with the loading of the wool press, pressing of wool, correctly pinning the bale, and removing the bale from the wool press in accordance with workplace procedures.
- 5.4 Assist with correctly branding and recording bale contents in accordance with on farm procedures and wool market representative requirements.
