- 3 Definitions
Industry practice – policies, procedures, and standards that competent practitioners in the gasfitting industry recognise as current industry best practice.
LPG – liquefied petroleum gas.
Other needs may include but are not limited to – compliance, commissioning, testing, retentions, and allowance for additional costs and overheads.

- 4 **Assessment**
Assessments requiring application or demonstration of skills and knowledge may be performed using workplace evidence or evidence derived from simulation or scenario-based activities.
Drawings and specifications prepared for Unit 32073, *Design gasfitting installations* may be used for performance criterion 1.1.
- 5 All tasks must be carried out in accordance with industry practice.
- 6 **Range**
Includes a minimum of three jobs;
includes a range of requirements between the jobs which may include but are not limited to – domestic, commercial, and industrial; natural gas and LPG; single level and multilevel building.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Cost gasfitting jobs.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Analyse the materials, labour, and other needs for the job using drawings and specifications of the system.

Range may include but is not limited – type, quantity, and time required.
- 1.2 Calculate the cost of the materials to be used in the gasfitting system.
- 1.3 Calculate the cost of the labour needed for the job.
- 1.4 Calculate the cost of other needs for the job.
- 1.5 Calculate the overall cost of the job.
- 1.6 Prepare schedules of quantities for quoting and tendering purposes.
