Outcome 1

Implement and monitor a parasite control programme and vaccination and booster schedule for horses.

Range adult horse, pregnant mare, foal with mare, weanling, yearling.

Performance criteria

1.1 Implement and monitor a parasite control programme for horses.

Range internal and external parasites; may include but is not limited to – strategic drench programme, wash udder and vulva post foaling, paddock mucked out or harrowed, cross grazing, faecal egg count; evidence of three is required.

1.2 Implement and monitor a vaccination and booster schedule for horses in consultation with the veterinarian.

Range may include but not limited to – tetanus, strangles, salmonella, equine herpes virus (EHV), rotavirus; evidence of two is required.

Outcome 2

Implement and monitor preventative health measures for new horses on a property.

Performance criteria

2.1 Implement and monitor preventative health measures when introducing a new horse to a property.

Range includes but is not limited to – internal parasite control, external parasite control, vaccination, check of vital signs, general health status, quarantine; evidence of three is required.
