Dependencies refer to the response elements and communities requiring support from the Logistics function so that they can complete their assigned tasks. It is a list of response elements, their support needs, and is quantified in terms of the resources required.

1.1 Describe the roles and responsibilities of the Logistics function in relation to incident management.

Range must include but is not limited to – sub-functions, inputs, outputs, key responsibilities.

1.2 Describe key internal and external relationships and dependencies for the Logistics function.

Range internal relationships must include – the Controller, Response

Manager, Planning, Operations, Welfare;

external relationships may include but are not limited to – partner agencies, support agencies, coordination centres, Logistics functions within other coordination centres, community; evidence of at least two external relationships is required.

1.3 Describe concepts and principles of the Logistics function and how they relate to the Logistics response.

Range

may include but is not limited to – ethical sourcing, assurance and compliance, financial prudence, transparency and accountability, simplicity, co-operation, economy, foresight, flexibility, sustainability, the 5R's (right supply, right quantity, right location, right time, right condition); evidence of three is required.

1.4 Explain how the structure of the Logistics function and sub-functions may change in relation to response size and incident complexity.

Range may include but is not limited to – need for each sub-function, how sub-functions may be amalgamated and staffed.

- 1.5 Explain how the focus and requirements of the Logistics function vary across different response levels, size and incident complexity.
- 1.6 Explain how factors can limit the Logistics function in relation to incident management.

Range

factors may include but are not limited to – the Controller's intent and direction, resource shortfalls, operating environment, freedoms and constraints, information from other functions and support agencies, risk, liabilities, accountabilities, legislation, authority, contracts;

evidence of three factors is required.

1.7 Describe potential impacts on the response if the dependency requirements are not understood at the start of a response.
