**Outcomes and performance criteria**

**Outcome 1**

Run a toolbox meeting with a roadmarking crew.

**Performance criteria**

- 1.1 Reasons why toolbox meetings are important are confirmed with participants.  
  
Range inform participants of operational changes, new and reviewed hazards and hazard controls, discussion of new safety data, participant engagement, communication, review work processes and procedures, short training session, plant and equipment.

- 1.2 Hazards, accidents, incidents and near misses on the roadmarking site are identified in terms of health and safety initiatives and actions taken to prevent them occurring again.
- 1.3 Hazardous substances are discussed in terms of actions taken to ensure they are handled and disposed of safely.
- 1.4 Behaviours to promote teamwork and improve safety on the roadmarking site are discussed.
- Range may include but are not limited to – wearing personal protective equipment, reporting unsafe work, offering solutions to address unsafe practices; evidence of two behaviours.
- 1.5 Programme of works is discussed in terms of tasks to be completed.
- 1.6 Meeting notes are recorded.
- Range attendance, topics, participant feedback, actions and due date.
- 1.7 Feedback on the meeting and recommendations for improvements are discussed with a supervisor.
- Range may include but are not limited to – scheduling of the meeting, length of the meeting, employee participation, providing positive feedback, conveying key health and safety messages, use of simple language, follow up actions, recording or meeting notes; evidence of two recommendations.
