3 Definitions

Audience proximity refers to the distance between the performer and their audience. Command of technique refers to working efficiently and demonstrating sustained control over all techniques used when applying make-up to meet the design concept. Creative collaborators refer to production roles such as director, stage manager; set designer, choreographer, costume designer or musical director.

Entertainment and event context refers to a performance or event such as dance, kapa haka, scripted drama, music performance (live or recorded in-studio), moving image production, physical theatre, devised work, performance art, and cultural event, circus that can take place in a range of venues, for example, stadia, theatres, event and convention centres, studios, parks and sports grounds, outdoor spaces, museums and galleries, places of worship, cultural places (e.g. marae), specialist classrooms.

Given work refers to a whole or substantial piece of a text, choreography, event, or production for an entertainment and event context.

Make-up includes hair design, including design and application of facial hair; for example, moustache and wigs.

Skilful technique refers to demonstrating well-practised control of techniques when applying make-up to meet the design concept.

Technical considerations refer to the use of make-up for reasons other than those associated with the character or role, such as reducing shine and covering skin blemishes.

- 4 Evidence of research may be collected via written, visual or oral methods such as a video diary, annotated sketches, diagrams, or written description.

 The given work must be agreed or specified by the teacher/tutor.
- Recommended for entry: Unit 26688, Demonstrate and apply knowledge of make-up for an entertainment and event context; and Unit 27701, Demonstrate and apply knowledge of make-up design for an entertainment and event context.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Develop a make-up design for a given work in an entertainment and event context.

Range a given work with a minimum of four performers each requiring a different make-up design.

Performance criteria

1.1 Analyse the given work in preparation for initial meeting with creative collaborators.

1.2 Undertake research to inform the make-up design in terms of the requirements for the given work.

Range

requirements may include but are not limited to – character and/or role creation or enhancement; communicating images, themes, feelings and moods; special effects; historical or cultural accuracy; audience proximity; lighting; colour correction; technical

considerations;

evidence of six requirements is required.

1.3 Use input and feedback from creative collaborators to inform the make-up design.

Range evidence of two creative collaborators is required.

1.4 Incorporate solutions to practical considerations within the make-up design.

Range practical considerations include but are not limited to – audience proximity, lighting, colour correction, special effects.

1.5 Develop, document, and visually communicate the make-up design in sufficient detail to allow the realisation of the characters.

Range

documentation may include but is not limited to – draft(s) and final design; planning chart for entire given work; character and make-up chart for each performer;

visually communicate may include but is not limited to – hand drawing using template, multi-media presentation (2D or 3D); detail may include but is not limited to – products and techniques

used for eyes, lips, face, hair.

1.6 Evaluate the design in terms of the extent to which it meets the requirements for the given work, the input from creative collaborators, and the practical considerations, and make amendments in response to any identified areas for improvement.
