<b>Purpose</b>	<p>People credited with this standard can, under supervision:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• inspect wall framing;</li> <li>• install weathertightness systems;</li> <li>• cut, fit, joint, and fix exterior wall claddings; and</li> <li>• clean and store tools, plant, and equipment used to cut, fit, joint, and fix exterior cladding.</li> </ul>

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### Guidance Information

- 1 Scope of practice**

Working *under supervision* means the ability to work to construction workplace standards under the supervision of a commercially competent practitioner whose role is to ensure the completed construction meets industry and regulatory requirements. This standard does not recognise commercial competence.
- 2 Assessment**

This unit standard must be assessed under the supervision of a commercially competent practitioner in construction workplace conditions that reflect:

  - current health, safety, industry, and workplace requirements; and
  - industry requirements for commercially acceptable timeframes.

Evidence generated for assessment against this standard must be verified by a person who has current expertise in the building and construction trades and has had the opportunity to regularly observe the candidate in the workplace.
- 3 Range**

Evidence generated for assessment against this standard must reflect workplace and industry requirements specified in:

  - documented worksite specifications, procedures, and practices;
  - manufacturer recommendations, specifications, and technical data sheets;
  - applicable specifications from other sources such as an architect, designer, engineer, or supervisor;
  - applicable material safety data sheets;
  - NZS 3604:2011 *Timber Framed Buildings*;
  - the New Zealand Building Code.

Evidence generated for assessment against this standard must reflect the requirements of:

- Building Act 2004
- Health and Safety at Work Act 2015
- Resource Management Act 1991
- Building Regulations 1992
- Building (Forms) Regulations 2004
- Health and Safety in Employment Regulations 1995.

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## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Inspect wall framing under supervision.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Check the placement and fixing of wall framing members meets cladding specifications.
- 1.2 Check the alignment of wall framing members is within tolerances.

### Outcome 2

Install weathertightness systems under supervision.

#### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Install building wrap, penetration flashing systems, and cavity systems.
- 2.2 Install flashing systems to window and door openings.  
  
Range        tape, head, side, sill.

### Outcome 3

Cut, fit, joint, and fix exterior wall cladding under supervision.

Range        lineal and sheet.

#### Performance criteria

- 3.1 Identify the required materials from the site documents.
- 3.2 Check delivered materials match materials order.  
  
Range        quality, quantity.

- 3.3 Cut, fit, joint, and fix exterior cladding.
- 3.4 Cut, fit, and fix cladding trim to provide a weathertight finish.

#### Outcome 4

Clean and store tools, plant, and equipment used to cut, fit, joint, and fix exterior cladding.

Range plant includes – any machinery, vehicle, vessel, aircraft, equipment (including personal protective equipment), appliance, container, implement, or tool; any component of any of those things; anything fitted or connected to any of those things;  
personal protective equipment includes – anything used or worn by a person (including clothing) to minimise risks to the person’s health and safety;  
air-supplied respiratory equipment.

#### Performance criteria

- 4.1 Clean workplace, tools, and plant used to cut, fit, joint, and fix exterior cladding.
- 4.2 Store tools and plant used to cut, fit, joint, and fix exterior cladding.
