#### **Guidance Information**

1 Assessment

This unit standard is intended to align with the *New Zealand Certificate in Flooring Installation – Specifications* and the New Zealand Certificate in Flooring Installation (Level 4) [Ref: 4296].

Evidence for this standard must reflect commercial competence.

Commercial competence refers to the ability to demonstrate knowledge and skills in the context of the currently accepted requirements of a business operating in a commercial environment.

Commercial competence must be confirmed by a person with current expertise in the flooring installation trade.

### 2 Definitions

*Bonded carpet installation* is also known as direct-stick system and double-bond system.

*Consumables* are those items necessary to secure and finish edges, junctions, joins, changes in planes, and height variations.

*Conventional carpet installation* is also known as the carpet gripper system. *Workplace procedures* refers to the documented procedures specific to a workplace which sets out the standard and the required practices of that workplace.

#### Skill specification

Assess condition of products supplied for carpet floor installation.

#### Knowledge

The types, purposes, and properties of tufted, woven, non-woven carpets, and carpet tiles.

Range natural, and synthetic fibre carpet.

The types, purposes, and properties of carpet underlays.

Range includes underlays used for – bonded carpet installation, conventional carpet installation.

The types and purpose of carpet consumables used for carpet installation.

Range includes consumables used for – bonded carpet installation, conventional carpet installation.

The types, purpose, and properties of adhesives used for carpet installation.

Range includes adhesives used for fixing – bonded carpet, carpet gripper, edging trims, stair nosings, seam sealing carpet joins, carpet edges.

The observable signs of manufacturing flaws and transportation damage in carpet and flooring products.

The methods for making minor repairs to damaged carpet without compromising the quality of the carpet installation.

Range return to supplier, clean, cut out, sew, seam, reposition.

## Skills

Check condition of supplied products for carpet installation prior to installation.

Take appropriate action prior to installation when supplied carpet product is flawed or damaged.

## Performance level guidance

Performance must reflect industry best practice guidance, manufacturers' specifications and workplace procedures.

Performance must include recognising the compatibility of the products used for the carpet floor covering installation.
