## 2 Definitions

*Manufacturer's application guidelines* include all the relevant application information for a specific special resin flooring system.

Special resin flooring system involves the integration of additional components, products or processes that are not included in mainstream resin flooring projects. Workplace procedures refers to the documented procedures specific to a workplace which sets out the standard and the required practices of that workplace.
