Skill specification and performance level guidance

Skill specification

Plan and lead a work programme, and quality assure manufacturing for precast concrete.

Knowledge

How to interpret and communicate precast concrete manufacture job specifications.

The information required, and methods to estimate labour and materials requirements.

Processes for scheduling required plant and equipment for precast concrete manufacturing.

Range plant and equipment includes – any machinery, tools and equipment (including personal protective equipment) required to complete the manufacture process.

How to evaluate casting area, mould construction, and reinforcing requirements.

Range requirements include the size of element to be manufactured, storage and postproduction care.

How to identify the hazards and manage the risks associated with precast concrete manufacture.

Range risks include – potential for serious harm or death from equipment failure, lack of knowledge, poor or non-compliance with safety and standard operating procedures.

The quality assurance requirements, including scheduling of quality checks and testing.

Skills

Plan a precast concrete manufacturing work programme.

Lead a precast concrete manufacturing work programme.

Range allocate – labour, work tasks, materials and equipment.

Manage risks associated with manufacturing precast concrete elements.

Move, store, and care for completed precast elements.

Quality assure the manufacture of precast concrete elements.

Quality check manufacturing processes according to specified schedule.

Maintain records of quality checking, pre and post pour testing and postproduction information.

Performance level guidance

Performance must reflect workplace procedures, current regulatory, industry and commercial standards relevant to precast concrete manufacturing operations.
