Establish and maintain a concrete construction site.

Knowledge

How to identify relevant site information from survey information in site plans.

The site facilities required and their role in allowing safe construction activity to start and progress.

Range facilities include – power and water supply, sheds, toilets, fences, and hoardings.

The access and delivery requirements for concrete construction sites.

The temporary storage and protection requirements for materials, tools, plant and equipment.

The requirements for management and disposal of on-site waste.

Range includes – ongoing clean up and management of on-site waste materials, wash down areas and correct treatment of hazardous materials.

Traffic management requirements on-site and onto the site.

Skills

Identify the site boundaries, the position of proposed and/or existing structures on site and any features or physical attributes requiring specific consideration for protection.

Organise and set up necessary site facilities according to plans and design specification.

Co-ordinate deliveries of materials, and movement of tools, plant and equipment around site to enable construction to progress.

Disestablish the site at the end of the construction programme.

Range includes – removal of all waste, reinstatement of boundary structures, cleaning and repair of any property affected by construction activity.

Performance level guidance

Performance must reflect workplace procedures, current regulatory, industry and commercial standards relevant to concrete construction.
