- 1 Definition
The term *LEO* refers to a Law Enforcement Officer.
- 2 Reference to *enterprise procedures* means that all activities must comply with the requirements contained in the current airport exposition, current airport company manuals and procedures, where applicable, and any relevant legislative and/or regulatory requirements, which may include but are not limited to: Civil Aviation Act 1990, relevant Civil Aviation Rules, Aviation Crimes Act 1972, Aviation Security Service Policies and Procedures, New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) Policy.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Carry out aviation surveillance and behaviour detection.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 An initial strategy for operations prior to the operational deployment is established in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.2 Environmental and individual baselines are established in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.3 Positioning, communications, and rotation are utilised to identify potentially high-risk individuals in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.4 Behaviour observation and analysis is assessed and reported on in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.5 Active engagement is conducted in accordance with enterprise procedures.

- 1.6 Resolution conversation is conducted in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.7 Behaviour detection referral screening is conducted in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.8 Appropriate LEO is notified and briefed in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.9 All reporting requirements are completed and submitted where appropriate in accordance with enterprise procedures.
