Current industry good practice means the range of actions currently accepted within the adventure and outdoor sector to manage the risk of harm to staff, participants, and others.

Outcome 1

Describe primary weather patterns in New Zealand.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Describe the effects of wind direction, wind speed, altitude and geography on temperature in the outdoors.
- 1.2 Describe local weather patterns including location variances and potential impact on outdoor activity.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of survival skills in the outdoors.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Justify the contents of a personal survival kit.
 - Range items to assist with fire lighting and shelter building, signal devices.
- 2.2 Construct an emergency fire using survival kit contents and materials gathered on location.
- 2.3 Explain actions lost people can take to assist search and rescue operations.

Outcome 3

Demonstrate knowledge of navigation.

Performance criteria

3.1 Explain the difference between magnetic and grid bearings for the purposes of navigation in the outdoors.

3.2 Use a map and compass.

Range orientate a map, take a bearing, follow a bearing, aiming off.

3.3 Describe two different modern navigational tools.
