- 1 Range
Evidence of reflection in relation to the assessment of a minimum of three different standards of at least 10 credits total or equivalent is required. Where assessors in an industry or sector usually assess single, larger standards, assessment of a single standard of at least 10 credits or equivalent could be considered sufficient. In either case, a minimum of three different assessment methods must have been used.
- 2 Definitions
Candidate is the person who is being assessed against this standard.
Learner is the person who the candidate is providing learning opportunities for.
Stakeholders refer to learners, as well as the tutor, provider, and/or client organisation(s).

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Reflect on own assessment practice and identify areas for improvement.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Reflect on own assessment practice in relation to the principles of assessment.

Range	principles of assessment include authenticity, consistency, currency, equity (open, honest and fair), reliability, sufficiency, validity.
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- 1.2 Reflect on the use of diagnostic, formative, and summative assessment
- Range diagnostic may include checking readiness of candidate for assessment.
- 1.3 Review own assessment practice using a variety of review methods.
- Range review methods may include but are not limited to – self-reflection and self-evaluation, stakeholder (including learner) feedback, assessment results.
- 1.4 Evaluate own assessment practice taking into consideration the self-reflection, review, and criteria for good assessment practices to identify areas of improvement for own assessment practice.
- Range criteria may include but are not limited to – quality of assessment judgments, comments support judgments, relevant feedback provided to learners, professional and ethical behaviours, avoiding over/under assessment, supporting evidence gathered as required.
- 1.5 An action plan with timeframes is developed to address identified areas for improvement of own assessment practice.
- Range plan must include actions for the short, medium, and long term.
