Guidance Information

1 Definitions

Cook Islands' culture for this standard involves any of the following aspects:

- unique Cook Islands' identities (*tū Māori Kuki Airani*)
- traditional and contemporary family relationships (*ngutuare tangata, kopu tangata*)
- different levels of relationship (*te au pirianga*)
- family island origins (*enua anauanga*)
- community leadership and authority (*mataiapo, ariki, kopu tangata, orometua*)
- customary practices (*peu ete akono'anga*)
- values and beliefs (*irinaki'anga*)
- spirituality (*vaerua*).
- 2 The presentation may use a variety of formats, technologies or techniques (including but not limited to documentary factual reports/interviews, visual media, oratory, performing arts) to clearly communicate an aspect of Cook Islands' culture.
- 3 It is recommended that evidence for assessment against this standard be in Cook Islands' Māori (*te reo Māori Kuki Airani*) or an island dialect in order to accurately represent the selected cultural knowledge and practice. There are a number of distinct dialects in the Cook Islands: Mangaia, Rarotonga, Ngāpūtoru (made up of Atiu, Mauke and Mitiaro, Aitutaki, Manihiki, Rakahanga, Tongareva, Pukapuka and Palmerston), however the main dialect being taught is the Rarotongan dialect -Rarotonga being the capital of the Cook Islands.
- 4 People gaining credit for this standard may not also gain credit for Unit 17162, Draw a conclusion after an investigation into an aspect of Pacific indigenous knowledge with direction; Unit 17165, Draw a conclusion after an investigation into an aspect of Pacific change and development with direction; Unit 17168, Draw a conclusion after an investigation into an aspect of Pacific Society with direction; or Unit 26538, Communicate understanding of an aspect of Pacific culture through a planned presentation with direction.
