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### Guidance Information

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### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Provide support services during a vegetation fire incident.

**Performance criteria**

1.1 Resources are requisitioned.

Range may include but is not limited to – personnel, maps, general equipment, specialised equipment, consumables, weather forecasts, support organisations.

1.2 Resources are received and dispatched.

Range may include but is not limited to – delivery information, location, support requirements, communications established.

**Outcome 2**

Communicate and action requests during a vegetation fire incident.

**Performance criteria**

2.1 Communication is maintained.

2.2 All requests and support services are actioned.

**Outcome 3**

Maintain records during a vegetation fire incident.

**Performance criteria**

3.1 Incident records are maintained.

3.2 Recording of resources are used.

3.3 Logs of people entering and leaving the fire ground are maintained.
