Guidance Information

This unit standard has been developed primarily for assessment within programmes leading to the New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trades Supervision (Level 5) with the Construction Related Manufacturing or Construction Related Trade strands [Ref: 4237].

2 Assessment

This unit standard must be assessed:

- in construction-related trade or manufacturing workplace conditions that reflect current health, safety, industry, and workplace requirements; and
- in everyday contexts within the scope of own role supervising construction-related manufacturing or construction-related trade work programmes.

It is expected that this unit standard will be awarded near the completion of a programme leading to the achievement of all outcomes of the New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trades Supervision (Level 5) Construction Related Manufacturing or Construction Related Trade strand [Ref: 4237].

Evidence generated for assessment against this standard must be verified by a person who has current expertise in supervision in a specific construction related trade or manufacturing trade and has had the opportunity to regularly observe the candidate in the workplace.

The candidate must be assessed in either:

- a specified construction-related trade or
- a specified construction-related manufacturing context.

All performance criteria must be met in the context specified.

3 Definitions

Construction-related manufacturing is the off-site manufacture of structural and non-structural elements of a building that are integrated into a building or construction on-site. It includes interior joinery, exterior joinery, glazing units, precast elements, pre-manufactured frames and trusses, and panelised building elements and others.

Construction-related trades are the sub-contracted trades that are not carried out by the main contractor within a construction work programme and may include electrical, plumbing, roofing, drainage, earthworks, foundations construction and others. Construction related work programme is the schedule of activities for a sub-contracted trade, or manufacturing trade component of a construction contract. Workplace procedures refers to the documented procedures specific to a workplace which set out the standard and required practices of that workplace.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Maintain knowledge of regulations and compliance for a specific construction-related trade or manufacturing work programme.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Review information in relation to regulations and compliance for a specific construction-related trade or manufacturing work programme.
- 1.2 Plan and implement strategies to maintain currency of knowledge for a specific construction-related trade or manufacturing work programme.

Range currency of knowledge includes – regulations, standards, approved codes of practice.

Outcome 2

Maintain currency of knowledge of technologies, practices, and materials for a specific construction-related trade or manufacturing work programme.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Review information in relation to technologies, practices, and materials for a specific construction-related trade or manufacturing work programme.
- 2.2 Plan and implement strategies to maintain currency of knowledge in relation to technologies, practices and materials for a specific construction-related trade or manufacturing work programme.

Outcome 3

Provide technical supervision for a construction-related trade or manufacturing trade work programme.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Monitor a team to determine compliance with regulations for a construction-related trade or manufacturing trade work programme.
- 3.2 Provide accurate and timely technical advice to the team.

Range technologies, practices, materials.

3.3 Supervise the team to establish compliance with technical specifications and plans of the work programme. Address any areas of non-compliance to meet work programme requirements and according to workplace procedures.
