1 Definitions

Design principles include – line, form, texture and colour, proportion, and balance. Legislative requirements refer to the obligations of the employer and/or employee under the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and Health (Hairdressers) Regulations 1980.

Sectioning can also be called zoning.

- In this unit standard all work must comply with legislative requirements and must ensure optimum hair condition and maximum client comfort at all times.
- 3 Essential underpinning skills and knowledge for this standard are covered by standard Unit 33204, *Demonstrate knowledge of the foundations of hair design*, and Unit 33228, *Demonstrate knowledge of hair design elements and principles*.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Create a plan for a particular hairstyle.

Range hairstyle can be any of – blow drying, setting, and/or cutting on long hair.

Performance criteria

1.1 Desired hairstyle is selected and design principles are identified.

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1.2 Desired style is planned to meet hairstyle outcome.

Range plan must include – sequence of construction, hair preparation, sectioning, tools, techniques, placement of techniques, products.

1.3 Plan is created to meet the desired style.

Outcome 2

Create a plan for a hairstyle to complement an individual client.

Range

plan must be for a different style to that used for outcome 1; hairstyle can be any of – blow drying, setting, and/or cutting on long hair (or long hair, blow drying, setting, cutting).

Performance criteria

2.1 Desired hairstyle is selected for the individual client.

Range includes but is not limited to – suiting the client's facial features, bone structure, body proportions, hairlines, growth patterns.

- 2.2 Design principles are identified in relation to the desired hairstyle.
- 2.3 Plan is created to match the desired style outcome.

Range plan must include – sequence of construction, hair preparation, sectioning, tools, techniques, placement of techniques, products.
