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### Guidance Information

- 1 The basic principles underpinning tikanga are common, but while there are some constants, the details of performance of tikanga, and their explanation, may differ. These differences may be at a whānau, hapū, iwi, marae or rohe level. The context of the learning should include the tikanga of the local mana whenua (if capable) but learning others' tikanga is also encouraged.
- 2 Definitions  
*Poukai hui* refers to a Māori gathering organised by individual marae within the Kingitanga movement. Each marae hosts the event on a specific date assigned to them. The Kingitanga movement plays a significant role in overseeing and co-ordinating the Poukai gatherings, ensuring they align with the principles and values of the Māori monarchy.
