Purpose	Learners credited with this unit standard are able to write a variety of text types in Gagana Tokelau on everyday experiences.

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## **Guidance Information**

- 1 Gagana Tokelau refers to the authentic language of Tokelau as communicated in the Pacific Island nation and in New Zealand.
- 2 It is recommended that:
  - the outcomes are assessed as part of an integrated unit of work, relevant to the learning context of the learner;
  - ii assessment be conducted in conjunction with assessment against other Gagana Tokelau unit standards at this level.
- It is recommended that learners produce a portfolio of writing over a period of time that includes a variety of text types in Gagana Tokelau, selecting at least two pieces of crafted writing from their portfolio for assessment.
- The quality of the texts in selection, considered as a whole, is more important than length:
  - i writing must be long enough to generate sufficient evidence for assessment;
  - ii suggested approximate word count is up to 100 150 words for each text;
  - iii minimum of two text types which have been created for different purposes;
  - text types may include but are not limited to community event recount, activities newsletter, instructional text, reports, blogs, emails, letters, diary entries, advertisements, songs, speeches;
  - v texting abbreviations are not permitted.
- Learners must show the ability to communicate beyond the immediate context, i.e. past, present, and/or future events. The use of the past and/or future, however, is not mandatory in all pieces of writing.

# 7 Definitions

Everyday experiences refer to the learner's personal life and past, present and/or future experiences, for example - kāiga (family), hokotaga (family relationships), takaloga (sports), tufuga (arts and crafts), fakatau meakai (buying food), fakatau (shopping), kaiga (home), fakamatala (describing local places) and fakafiaga (celebrations).

Language features include the way words work in sentences. For example:

- verb tense markers such as;
  - o kua indicates that the event had happened, e.g., Ko te aoga kua uma.
  - o ka signals something that is yet to happen, e.g., Ko te aoga ka uma.
  - o e signposts something that is in progress, e.g., Ko te aoga e heki uma.
- specific verb patterns to express future intention or singular and plural verb forms.

Language conventions appropriate to the register of generally accepted usage or practice.

Variety refers to texts selected from a range of different text types which have been created for different audiences and purposes.

Write refers to organising text in a linguistically and culturally appropriate format and style.

# Outcomes and performance criteria

#### **Outcome 1**

Write a variety of text types in Gagana Tokelau on everyday experiences.

## Performance criteria

- 1.1 Texts are written in a culturally appropriate Gagana Tokelau manner that communicates personal information that relate to everyday experiences and are fit for purpose and audience.
- 1.2 Language conventions and language features appropriate to the text type are used.
- 1.3 Communication is achieved overall, despite inconsistencies.

Range inconsistencies may include but are not limited to – format,

spelling, lexical choice, level of formality, language conventions or

language features.
