# Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of woollen carding and the carding machine.

### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Woollen carding is explained in terms of purpose and yarn characteristics.
- 1.2 Sections of card are identified and described in terms of their function.
  - Range may include hopper, chute, feed, scribbler, vegetable matter removal, intermediate feed, carder section, breast, tape condenser, rubbing motion, creel, metal detectors.

- 1.3 Card rollers are identified and described in terms of their function.
  - Range may include feed roller, swift, worker, fancy, stripper, doffer, peralta, fly stripper, condenser stripper, angle stripper, transfer roller, licker-in.
- 1.4 Carding faults are identified and described in terms of significance and reporting procedures.
  - Range may include neps, excessive vegetable matter, uneven slubbing, fibre drop-out, colour variation, count variation, dropping ends, roller robbing, excess fly, contamination.

## Outcome 2

Prepare and operate a woollen card.

### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Personal protective equipment is used.
- 2.2 Safe work methods are demonstrated.
- 2.3 Machine is prepared for operation.

Range fibre blend identified, hopper loaded, fibre run through card, empty spools in place.

- 2.4 Machine is operated.
- 2.5 Fibre is carded.

Range hopper maintained, intermediate feed breaks mended, broken ends mended, full spools doffed, test samples taken, waste return functioning.

2.6 Production and quality tests are recorded.

### Outcome 3

Identify and fix operational and product faults.

### **Performance criteria**

- 3.1 Web and slubbing faults are identified and corrective action is taken.
  - Range may include uneven web, neps, excessive vegetable matter, uneven slubbing, fibre drop-out, colour variation, count variation, dropping ends, roller robbing, excess fly, contamination.
- 3.2 Test results are interpreted and corrective action is taken.

3.3 Card malfunction is identified and corrective action is taken, if required.

## Outcome 4

Keep card and work area clean.

## Performance criteria

- 4.1 Card and card area are kept clean during processing.
- 4.2 Carding machine is cleaned at end of a batch.
- 4.3 Waste fibre is collected and sorted according to type to prevent contamination.
