## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Demonstrate intermediate skiing skills on blue terrain at a snowsport area.

### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Demonstrate basic parallel turns using a pole touch.
- 1.2 Demonstrate efficient use of rotational, lateral and vertical planes of movement in executing parallel turns.

1.3 Demonstrate linked medium radius and long radius parallel turns through the fall line.

1.4 Demonstrate speed control using the shape of the turn.

Range speed control includes – stopping, slowing down, speeding up;  
shape of the turn includes – short and long radius turns, shallow turns, deep turns.
