2 Definitions

Duty manager – certificated manager responsible for the sale and supply of alcohol under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, which requires a duty manager to be on duty when alcohol is on sale or supplied to the public, except when exempted under the Act.

Licensing bodies – Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority, District Licensing Committees.

LAP – Local Alcohol Policy as defined in the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and its implications for licensed premises.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 is outlined in terms of its object and purpose.

- 1.2 The structure and responsibilities of licensing bodies, and the role of the police, medical officer of health, and inspectors are identified and described in terms of the Act.
- 1.3 Licence types are explained in terms of legislative requirements and conditions.
- Range licence types include but are not limited to – on licence, off licences, club licences, special licences; requirements and conditions include but are not limited to – signage, designated areas, duty manager, appointment of temporary and acting managers, hours of trading, prohibited persons, supply of low alcoholic beverages and non-alcoholic refreshments and free water, availability of food, information about alternative forms of transport, responsible service.
- 1.4 Procedures for applications for, and renewals of, licence types and temporary authorities are identified and outlined in terms of the Act.
- 1.5 The application and renewal procedure and criteria for manager’s certificates are identified and described in terms of the Act.
- 1.6 Categories of offences are identified, and offences under each category are described in terms of the Act.
- 1.7 Powers of entry on to the licensed premises of inspectors and police, and closure by police are identified and described in terms of the Act.
- 1.8 The purpose and function of a LAP is described in terms of the Act.
