Special notes

- 1 Definition
Company requirements refer to instructions to staff on policy and procedures which are communicated in verbal or written form. These requirements may include but are not limited to – manufacturers' procedures, company safety procedures, legislative requirements, industry codes of practice and standards.
- 2 Safe working practices meet the obligations of the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992 and its subsequent amendments. This includes practices such as the correct use and storage of tools, safe lifting, protection from the sun, and correct use of protective clothing and equipment.

Elements and performance criteria

Element 1

Prepare sticks for bundling for Pacific oyster (tio) spat-catching.

Performance criteria

1.1 Preparation of sticks meets company requirements.

Range preparation may include – removal of old shell and fouling organisms, de-nailing, removal of sediment, culling of unusable sticks.

1.2 Company throughput requirements are met.

1.3 Tools and machinery used are operated safely and correctly in accordance with company requirements.

Range tools and machinery may include but are not limited to – scraper, rumbler.

Element 2

Bundle sticks for Pacific oyster (tio) spat-catching.

Performance criteria

2.1 Sticks are bundled to meet company requirements.

Range may include but is not limited to – tightness of strapping, spacing of sticks, frame construction.

2.2 Company throughput requirements are met.

2.3 Safe work practices are used in accordance with company requirements.

Please note
