- 3 White and yellow grade orienteering courses are to be prepared and set on two different orienteering maps.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Develop white and yellow grade orienteering course plans.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The areas are chosen and meet NZOF standards.

- 1.2 Participants needs and objectives are identified.
- Range may include but is not limited to – time, participant ability and fitness, skill level, purpose, outcomes.
- 1.3 Land access, environment, and risk issues are identified and strategies to manage them developed.
- Range may include but is not limited to – permission, vehicle access, boundaries, toilets, rubbish disposal, hazards, emergency procedures.
- 1.4 Courses are planned and difficulty levels meet participant needs and NZOF standards.

Outcome 2

Prepare and set white and yellow grade orienteering courses.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Placement of control markers matches locations on the map and are appropriately sited to meet the level of the courses and NZOF standards.
- Range may include but is not limited to – site at junctions, height of markers.
- 2.2 Control descriptions (if used) match control locations and meet NZOF requirements.
- 2.3 Set course enables participants to compete fairly.
- 2.4 Course is modified in response to unexpected factors or hazards and the course plan is altered accordingly while still meeting NZOF requirements.
