### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Analyse race relations up to the Treaty of Waitangi.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Māori tino rangatiratanga prior to the Treaty of Waitangi is analysed to account for its nature.
- 1.2 Activities of Europeans are analysed to account for their impact on Māori society.
- 1.3 Race relations are analysed to account for the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi.

#### Outcome 2

Analyse the Treaty of Waitangi and Māori and Pākehā assertions of sovereignty.

#### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Māori and Pākehā interpretations of the Treaty of Waitangi are analysed to account for differences in understanding.

- 2.2 Methods used by Māori and Pākehā to assert sovereignty are analysed to account for their nature.

### Outcome 3

Analyse the origins and consequences of the New Zealand Wars.

#### Performance criteria

- 3.1 The origins of the New Zealand Wars are analysed to account for the contributing factors.
- 3.2 The consequences of the New Zealand Wars are analysed to account for their impact on Māori-Pākehā relations.
