2.2 Install components in accordance with drawings where available, and manufacturers' instructions.

Range components include but are not limited to – switchboard tray, gear

plate, cable supports, switch gear, control gear, metering

equipment.

- 2.3 Terminate cable looms, fit cover plates, and label switchboards.
- 2.4 Leave switchboards clean and ready for testing and commissioning.
